

Seated Segway Disclosure Form

By signing this form, I acknowledge that I have communicated with a Living Spinal representative about all of the following disclosures regarding the Seated Self Balancing product line. I am aware of the following:

- Seated Segways are custom built to order and imported, and are therefore non-returnable and non-refundable.
- A mechanically-inclined installer must be assigned that will assist in completing the installation of the device.

- Due to the discontinued by manufacturer Segway I2, X2, I2 SE and X2 SE products being the only recommended self-balancing platform for these products, the Segway device will be used, refurbished, and fully tested.
- Riding a Seated Segway comes with inherent risk of falling, tipping, and crashing, especially in the first few weeks of use. Safety gear is strongly recommended including a helmet, knee pads, elbow pads, and wrist guards. It is also strongly recommended that at least 1 but preferably 2 able-bodied people standby in the first several uses of the Seated Segway to spot the rider when mounting/dismounting, operating landing gear, and riding.

“Standby” Mode - Disclosure

- “Standby” Mode is a mode of a Segway that reduces the power output and movement to about 15% of normal riding. For the purposes of a Seated Segway, it’s use is to limit movement for transfers and parking of the unit.
- **Blumil model-** operating the right side landing gear lever will actuate the sensors on the Segway and turn on/off the “standby” mode.
- **Addseat model-** operating the right side landing gear lever will actuate the sensors on the Segway and turn on/off the “standby” mode. The Addseat has 2 landing gear levers, and only the right side lever actuates “standby” mode. This right side lever must be lowered first, and raised first when parking or unparking the unit.
- **Going+ model** - there is a sensor on the seat, where simply sitting down onto the seat deactivates “standby” mode, and transferring off the unit will activate “standby” mode.

By signing this form, I understand the following physical requirements are strongly recommended by Living Spinal for users of Seated Segways

- Strong abdominal and trunk control
- Functional use of hands and fingers, ability to grip lever and press with tricep
- Ability to maintain alertness and awareness of surroundings

This product is generally not recommended for the following:

- People with advanced cases of the following disabilities: Quadriplegia, Cerebral Palsy, Muscular Dystrophy and other impairments affecting abdominal and arm/hand/finger control to a high degree.
- Users with high muscle weakness, frail constitution, and slow reaction time

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If I have the physical characteristics that are outlined above as not recommended for eligibility with Seated Segway use, I realize and accept that by purchasing and operating a Seated Segway I may be putting myself at risk for injury due to inability to adequately operate the device.
